These conversations unfurl in fragments against the backdrop of the Northern Arizona landscape, where a crater field constructed by NASA to replicate the lunar surface has eroded and been forgotten.

Erosion along the banks of the Rio Grande ensures that the border between the US and Mexico is unfixed, and always moving. The film is composed of happenings along the river: river crossings, amateur ornithologists, wildlife, construction sites of the separation wall, and encounters with border patrol. "The Valley" questions not only who has the right to move across the boundary, but who is permitted to look?
